#### Historical note

In May of 1962 the Director of Defense, Research and Engineers sent a memo to the Joint Chiefs of Staff regarding the establishment of a military medical research program to improve the capability of the Army Medical Service to support action in Southeast Asia. In response the Surgeon General established a survey group of 10 people to tour the Pacific area and Southeast Asia. Eight officers from the Army and two from the Air Force, including Walter Reed Army Institute of Research Deputy Director COL William D. Tigertt, were involved in the appraisal of problems in Vietnam. This survey was interrupted by an outbreak of plague around Saigon. A Laboratory Diagnostic Unit was created at 142 Hai Bai Trung to study plague and remained operational until the WRAIR medical research team arrived.

The survey group had recommended expansion of this existing medical research program to include the establishment of a medical research team in Saigon under the command of the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research (WRAIR). The team was approved on 3 September 1963 and began in November 1963 with the arrival of the team's first Chief, LTC Paul Teschan. He quickly formed liaisons with U.S. and Vietnamese medical units, including the Public Health Division of the U.S. Operations Mission, the U.S. Agency for International Development, the Minister of Health, the Pasteur Institute, and medical school faculties.

The mission of the team was to conduct military medical research studies in the following four areas: to study infectious diseases; to study combat surgery; to study methods and effectiveness of military medical advisors; and to field test medical equipment. The team moved into their permanent laboratory at 179 Cong Ly, Saigon in June 1964. The team became collocated with the Pasteur Institute of Vietnam, located conveniently across the street from 179 Cong Ly, and worked closely with it on essentially all infectious disease research efforts.

Later there were also several special projects supported by WRAIR and the U.S. Army Medical Research and Development Command (USAMRDC) including a FEST (Field Epidemiologic Survey Team) from 1966 to 1968, a Trauma Study Section (TSS) from 1966 to 1970, and a field photography team. The unit was disestablished on 30 April 1971.

## Scope and content of the collection

The USAMRT-Vietnam records include correspondence, reports, unpublished reports, photocopies of agreements and Memorandums of Understanding, protocols and procedures, memorabilia, photographs, and slides. The bulk of the material is the correspondence.

Processing note: Original order was retained wherever possible. The correspondence files were originally arranged in reverse chronological order in the individual folders, but are now in chronological order. FEST correspondence was found in separate folders and it is maintained as a separate series, however, there is much reference to the FEST in the general correspondence. There were several folders that contained subject specific correspondence. These folders have been maintained and are found in their own series after the general correspondence series. Exact duplicates have been removed and discarded. Most metal staples, paper clips and metal binders were removed. All records have been rehoused in acid-free folders.

Most of the photographs were found in the correspondence and have been moved to photograph boxes with separation sheets left in the correspondence folders. A green cloth binder with photographs and textual records documenting the ribbon-cutting ceremony in 1964 and the closing ceremony in 1971 was dismantled to remove some of the acidic paper and plastic sleeves and has been recreated in photo box 1. The binder also included slides from different rolls of film. The slides appeared to have been somewhat randomly organized at some later date. Using some notes on the slides and the references in the correspondence, the slides were arranged more accurately; however the previous random order is obvious due to the numbers written on the slides in permanent ink. Many of the slides had captions, very few had dates.

A folder that contained 28 reprints, 26 of which concerned melioidosis, has been discarded. None of the reprints were annotated. A list of the reprints is available. Please contact the archivist for more information.

### Series IV: Field Epidemiologic Survey Team (FEST) Files, 1965-1968, 1983 (7 folders)

This series contains the correspondence that relates to the Field Epidemiologic Survey Team (FEST). FEST was organized in May 1966 to study the epidemiology of tropical diseases in the environment in which they were transmitted. The team was composed of Special Forces officers and enlisted technicians trained at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, and WRAIR in laboratory and field epidemiological skills. They were deployed to Vietnam on 26 September 1966. Scientific areas of focus included tropical sprue, febrile illness, Schistosomiasis, filariasis, dengue, and malaria. FEST was considered part of the Saigon team for administration and logistics and was constituted as an element of WRAIR, but it was attached to Headquarters, 5th Special Forces Group. The bulk of the correspondence is by the FEST Chiefs LTC Llewellyn Legters and LTC Charles Webb. Studies continued through 1968.
