Historical note:

In 1971, the Government of Brazil began building a TransAmazon highway. The resulting disturbance of virtually untouched terrain in the Amazon Basin was deemed equivalent to the disturbance of terrain caused by military actions, therefore the construction of the highway created a unique peacetime opportunity to study the emergence of new diseases and any amplification of existing diseases. The United States Army Medical Research Unit, Belem, Brazil (USAMRU- Belem) began on 2 July 1973 as a sponsored research project under the umbrella of an agreement between the Government of Brazil and the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO). USAMRU-Belem was a special foreign activity of the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research and functioned as an element of the Instituto Evandro Chagas (IEC). The Unit was disestablished in 1979.

Scope and content of the collection:

The USAMRU- Belem records include correspondence, agreements, and ephemera. The bulk of the material is the correspondence.

Processing note: Original order was retained wherever possible. Materials had been arranged in reverse chronological order. They are now filed chronologically. Exact duplicates were removed and
