Historical note

The Filarioid Diseases Project began in 1959 as a responsibility of the United States Army Medical Research and Development Command (USAMRDC). Professor Louis Van der Berghe, Director of the Institut pour la Recherche Scientifique on Afrique Centrale (IRSAC), invited the USAMRDC to investigate the epidemiological and epizootiological relationships of filarioid parasites and other tropical diseases. IRSAC was a quasi-governmental research institution located on the west shore of Lake Kivu and covered scientific investigations in the Belgian Congo. USAMRDC transferred responsibility of this overseas project to WRAIR on 30 June 1960. Political unrest during the transition from the colonial government to local rule in the Belgian Congo led the project officer CPT Donald L. Price to move his operations to Makerere College in Kampala, Uganda in July of 1960. Donald Price was welcomed by Makerere College and he quickly established a new laboratory in their medical school. Donald Price was succeeded by MAJ Norman Wilks in 1962 and LTC Dale Wykoff in 1966. The unit was disestablished in July of 1969.

Scope and content of the collection

The Filarioid Diseases Project records include correspondence, reports, newsletters, and photographs. The bulk of the material is the correspondence.

Custodial History:

Four reports (Earl Fife, 1962; Wally Murdoch, 1967; Bryce Walton, 1968; and Dale Wykoff, 1968) were donated by COL Dale Wykoff by way of COL Robert JT Joy in 2003.

Processing note: Original order was retained wherever possible. The correspondence files were originally arranged in reverse chronological order in the individual folders, but are now in chronological order. Monthly newsletters and annual reports were found in separate folders and they are maintained as a separate series. Exact duplicates have been removed and discarded. Most metal staples, paper clips and metal binders were removed. All records have been rehoused in acid-free folders. All of the photographs in series III were found in their own folder and have been maintained as a separate series. There are a couple of photographs in the correspondence series.
