# AMSARA FY 2023 Annual Report Unavailability Statement

### Statement:

The absence of comprehensive disqualification codes within FY 2021 and 2022 applicant data extracted from the United States Military Entrance Processing Command (USMEPCOM) USMIRS 1.1 database has precluded the publication of the FY 2023 AMSARA Annual Report. Within these data provided to AMSARA, approximately 5% of applicants had disqualification codes, which is significantly lower than historical disqualification rates (~15%), making comparisons invalid and reporting inaccurate. While multiple corrective actions were considered, none of them could be successfully implemented before the report production deadline.
