Historical note:

The Walter Reed Army Institute of Research (WRAIR) traces its history back to 1893 when the Surgeon General of the Army, George Miller Sternberg, issued General Order #5 creating the Army Medical School. The idea for an Army Medical School had initially been proposed by Surgeon General Hammond during the Civil War, when civilian medical school training proved to be deficient in addressing military problems. Due to political differences it was not to be for another 30 years. In 1893, General Sternberg did not have the resources to create an undergraduate military medical school so he chose a post-graduate curriculum and made use of the existing staffs of the Office of the Surgeon General, the Army Medical Library, and the Army Medical Museum. Prominent examples include Walter Reed, Curator of the Army Medical Museum, who became the Professor of Clinical and Sanitary Microscopy; and John Shaw Billings, Librarian of the Surgeon General's Office, who became the Professor of Military Hygiene.

The institute underwent a series of name changes that reflected its evolving mission beginning with the Army Medical Department Professional Service School in 1923, the Army Medical Department Research and Graduate School in 1947, the Army Medical Service Graduate School in 1950, and finally to the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research in 1955.

The name change in 1923 involved the combination of the Army Medical School with the Army Veterinary School, to be joined by the newly formed Army Dental School in 1925, as the Army Medical Department Professional Service School. All three schools shed their tactical teaching

functions to the Army Medical Department Field Service School in 1946 and assumed an entirely professional nature.

Former teaching schedules of 6, 8, and 12 month courses were discontinued in 1940 in anticipation of the event of war. New courses were designed and introduced in July 1941 of one month, later 2 months, duration to indoctrinate the non-military medical officers in military medical practice. Emphasis was on problems commonly encountered in foreign lands, but that were frequently unknown in the United States.

The next name change in 1947 to the Army Medical Department Research and Graduate School redesignated the schools as divisions, but functionally little changed.

Soon after WWII came an increase in the number of overseas laboratories, namely Puerto Rico (1950), Malaysia (1953), Panama (1958), Uganda (1959), Thailand (1961), Vietnam (1963), Japan (1968), Brazil (1972), Kenya (1973), Germany (1977), and Korea (1988).

In addition to name changes it also moved facilities a number of times before settling in the purpose built school building on the Walter Reed Army Medical Center campus in 1923. Its initial location was at the corner of 7th and South B Streets, SW, DC, in the Army Medical Museum. It then moved to 721 13th Street in 1910; followed by 604 Louisiana Avenue in 1916; and finally to Building 40 on the campus of the Walter Reed Army Medical Center in 1923, where it remained until 1999. New wings were added to Building 40 in 1932 and 1962, but eventually costs to maintain the building and upgrade it were too great and a new purpose built laboratory was constructed in 1999 where it currently resides.

In 1958, WRAIR became a major subordinate activity of the newly formed U.S. Army Medical Research and Development Command.

In 1942 the US Army purchased the land and buildings that had previously been part of the National Park Seminary, a school for girls in the early part of the 1900's, at Forest Glen, Maryland. These buildings were put to therapeutic use for wounded soldiers convalescing during WWII. Starting in the early 1950s laboratories were constructed to house the expanding mission of the WRAIR. In 1999, Building 40 was shut when the new state of the art laboratory at Forest Glen was completed and all WRAIR functions moved off of the campus of the Walter Reed Army Medical Center.

Scope and content of the collection:

Included are AV materials that contain portraits; buildings; ceremonial events; class photographs; and contain information pertaining to the formation, closure, realignment, or other changes to offices or their administrative functions and responsibilities.

Custodial History:

The Tropical Medicine course class photographs, the photographs of COL George Callender, COL Richard Strong, LTC Thomas Mackie, and the photograph of 5 faculty members in 1946 were donated by COL George W. Hunter III in 1984. The class photographs for the Advanced Preventive Medicine Course and the Global Medicine Course were transferred by the Division of Preventive Medicine in 2011. The Army Dental School photographs were received from the US Army Dental Trauma and

Research Detachment when it was BRAC'd in 2010. 6 photographs of the unofficial ground-breaking ceremony received from Dr. Sara Rothman on 9 March 2012. The provenance of the remaining records is unknown.

Processing note: Many of the photographs, slides, and negatives were labeled and dated and were able to be matched to correspondence or reports for context, however there were some that could not be identified or dated.

The slides for the exhibit "80 years of service to the soldier and the people he serves" had been placed in a manila envelope with their corresponding scripts, however the slides were not in any order. One slide show had numbered slides (slide #22 is missing) and was easy to recreate, the other slide show was recreated following the script and may not be exactly correct. Two slides do not appear to match any narration in either script.

Some of the class photos include the faculty as well as the students. The Army School of Nursing was authorized in 1918 and discontinued in 1933. The school was not abolished, but merely closed for the time being as there was no need for the Army to train nurses when civilian training schools produced enough nurses. Subseries 5: Medical Basic Sciences Course (8-0-26), Military Medicine and Allied Science Course, Research Training Fellowship Program (8-0-38), Military Medical Sciences Course, Medical Research Fellowship Program, and Hoff Medal, 1950-2008

This subseries includes class photographs of the Research Training Fellowship Program (formerly Military Medicine and Allied Sciences Course). The Medical Basic Sciences Course (8-0-26) first became a separate formal course in 1948. It is the successor to the original basic sciences course which has been given in one form or another since the inception of the Army Medical School. It provided refresher education for medical officers returning from the Korean War. In 1954 it changed format and became the Military Medicine and Allied Sciences Course (8-0-38). The course was renamed the Research Training Fellowship Program for the school year 1970-1971. The student with the highest class proficiency is awarded the Hoff Medal. Photographs of the Hoff Medal awardees for each class follow the class photographs. Administrative and class records can be found in the Records of the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research. Photographs marked with an * were framed copies of the graduating class that had been displayed in the hallways of Building 40 prior to the move to Building 503 in 1999 and have been removed from their frames and are in drawer S76.**
