Historical note:

The Walter Reed Army Institute of Research (WRAIR) traces its history back to 1893 when the Surgeon General of the Army, George Miller Sternberg, issued General Order #5 creating the Army Medical School. The idea for an Army Medical School had initially been proposed by Surgeon General Hammond during the Civil War, when civilian medical school training proved to be deficient in addressing military problems. Due to political differences it was not to be for another 30 years. In 1893, General Sternberg did not have the resources to create an undergraduate military medical school so he chose a post-graduate curriculum and made use of the existing staffs of the Office of the Surgeon General, the Army Medical Library, and the Army Medical Museum. Prominent examples include Walter Reed, Curator of the Army Medical Museum, who became the Professor of Clinical and Sanitary Microscopy; and John Shaw Billings, Librarian of the Surgeon General's Office, who became the Professor of Military Hygiene.

The institute underwent a series of name changes that reflected its evolving mission as a strictly teaching operation to its current predominately research mission. The name changes began with the Army Medical Department Professional Service School in 1923, the Army Medical Department Research and Graduate School in 1947, the Army Medical Service Graduate School in 1950, and finally to the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research in 1955.

The name change in 1923 involved the combination of the Army Medical School with the Army Veterinary School, to be joined by the newly formed Army Dental School, into the Army Medical

Department Professional Service School. All three schools shed their tactical teaching functions to the Army Medical Department Field Service School in 1946 and assumed an entirely professional nature.

Former teaching schedules of 6, 8, and 12 month courses were discontinued in 1940 in anticipation of the event of war. New courses were designed and introduced in July 1941 of one month, later 2 months, duration to indoctrinate the non-military medical officers in military medical practice. Emphases was on problems commonly encountered in foreign lands, but were frequently unknown in the United States. The course in Tropical Medicine was the first class to be conducted in 1941 and was to remain a standard course until 1993.

The next name change in 1947 to the Army Medical Department Research and Graduate School re-designated the schools as divisions, but functionally little changed. The mission of the AMDRGS was that of training, diagnosis and consultation, research, and the production of certain biological and diagnostic agents.

Soon after WWII came an increase in the number of overseas laboratories, namely Puerto Rico (1950-1966), Malaysia (1953-1989), Panama (1958-1976), Uganda (1959-1969), Thailand (1961-present), Vietnam (1963-1971), Japan (1968-1972), Brasilia, Brazil (1972-1999), Belem, Brazil (1973-1979), Kenya (1973-present), Germany (1977-2015), and Korea (1988).

In 1958, WRAIR became a major subordinate activity of the newly formed U.S. Army Medical Research and Development Command.

In addition to name changes it also moved facilities a number of times before settling in the first purpose built school building on the Walter Reed Army Medical Center campus in 1923. Its initial location was at the corner of 7th and South B Streets, SW, DC, in the Army Medical Museum. It then moved to 721 13th Street in 1910; followed by 604 Louisiana Avenue in 1916; and finally to Building 40 on the campus of the Walter Reed Army Medical Center in 1923, where it remained until 1999. New wings were added to Building 40 in 1932 and 1962, but eventually costs to maintain the building and upgrade it were too great and a new purpose built laboratory was constructed in 1999. In 1942 the US Army purchased the land and buildings that had previously been part of the National Park Seminary, a school for girls in the early part of the 1900's, at Forest Glen, Maryland. These buildings were put to therapeutic use for wounded soldiers convalescing during WWII. In time laboratories were constructed to house the expanding mission of the WRAIR. In 1999, Building 40 was shut when the new state of the art laboratory at Forest Glen was completed and all WRAIR functions moved off of the campus of the Walter Reed Army Medical Center.

Scope and content of the collection:

Included are correspondence, course information, meeting minutes, programs, brochures, memoranda, reports, newsletter articles, AV materials, and other records that contain information pertaining to the formation, closure, realignment, or other changes to WRAIR and its offices or their administrative functions and responsibilities.

Custodial History:

The Tropical Medicine Course lists of students and faculty, 1942-1946 and some corresponding graduation exercises pamphlets were donated by COL George W. Hunter III in 1984. *The Rare Times* were donated by Carl Alving, date unknown. The Japanese Army research reports on Tsutsugamushi were donated by Trygve O. Berge, date unknown. The Monthly Activity Reports for the Department of Medical Neurosciences, 1984-1998, (later the Division of Neurosciences in April 1995) were received

from the division on 28 August 2017, and for years 1999-2000 were received from the Public Affairs Officer on 5 September 2018.

Processing note: Original order was retained wherever possible. Exact duplicates were removed and discarded. Most metal staples, paper clips and metal binders were removed. All records have been rehoused in acid-free folders. Most of the AV materials had been stored separately from the paper records. Many of the photographs, slides, and negatives were labeled and dated and were able to be matched to correspondence or reports for context, however there were some that could not be identified or dated. See the Records of the WRAIR AV Materials for photographs, slides, and negatives.

Records in series I, Army Medical School, were all originally housed in notebooks. Some records, such as the meeting minutes, were hand inscribed in a notebook, while other records, such as the special orders, were pasted into a notebook. At some point these notebooks were cut apart or the records torn from their backings and placed in metal ringed binders. The pages were sandwiched in plastic sleeves with black construction paper. They have since been removed from these plastic and paper housings and placed into acid free folders. Some of the more fragile pages are in Mylar sleeves.

The Typhoid Field Trial (WHO) records had been arranged by location and this order was kept, with the exception that every location now has its own folder instead of the previous folder groupings.

Detailed description of the collection:

Series I: Administrative files, 1893-2015

This series contains records, correspondence, class schedules, class transcripts, special orders, attendance records, and survey responses from 1893 through 1941. The Army Medical School Records include meeting minutes, class transcripts; graduation exercises programs, and staff rosters. The meeting minutes were hand inscribed in a notebook by the then current secretary. The school's first secretary was Major Walter Reed. Meetings were on the first Monday of each month, October through

March, and whenever called by the president of the faculty. School issues discussed included the progress of the students, who would be invited to address the closing exercises, and the school curriculum. This series contains correspondence and reports created from 1951 to 1957 when the WRAIR was attempting to pass bills giving WRAIR the ability to grant a Master of Science, Master of Public Health and Doctor of Science degrees in medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine and in the biological sciences involved in health services. Three bills were proposed, H.R. 7813 in 1952, H.R.2329 in 1953, and H.R. 3516 in 1957. In light of the difficulties in passing a bill, WRAIR attempted to affiliate itself with Johns Hopkins University and George Washington University to have 2 Masters Degrees in Public Health and in Science conferred by one of these universities. This series includes information, programs, guest lists, and invitations to WRAIR dances. Accompanying photographs for the Hail and Farewell celebrations and the Commandant's Balls can be found in the Records of the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research AV Materials. The records are arranged roughly by school name, by type and then chronologically.

Subseries 2: Bio-Sensor Research Project, 1968-1976

The Bio-Sensor Research Project was conceived in 1968 as a pilot program to determine the feasibility of training a dog to locate concealed contraband moving through military transportation channels. The program was to be expanded if successful. The program was assigned to the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research. The initial success with marijuana prompted an expansion to breed superior dogs to meet military requirements to track and locate the enemy; detect mines, trip wires, and tunnels; find casualties; and be free from common physical defects such as hip dysplasia. The project was deactivated in 1976 due to budget cuts. Photographs of the Bio-Sensor Research Project can be found in the records of the WRAIR AV Materials.

The Germfree Research files contain correspondence, reports, and photographs regarding the establishment of a germfree laboratory at WRAIR in collaboration with the University of Pennsylvania and Notre Dame University. The Department of Germfree Research was established in 1958 for the “investigation of fundamental problems of paramount importance to military medicine which cannot be solved with conventional animals and conventional laboratory and clinical techniques.” The Department was deactivated in September 1966. Series V: Military Medicine Courses and Medals, 1920-1999 and undated

This series contains the history and correspondence for the Sternberg Medal, the Hoff Medal, the Hoskins Medal (see Series IV: Army Veterinary School), the Dental Corps Medal, and the Slee Medal.

The Hoff Medal was endowed by Colonel John van Rensselaer Hoff in memory of his father Lt. Colonel Alexander R. Hoff, MC. The Hoff Medal was first awarded in 1901. It is awarded to the graduate of the Army Medical School with the highest average class standing. Later it was awarded to graduates of the Military Medicine and Allied Science Course.

The Sternberg Medal was first endowed in memory of Brigadier General George M. Sternberg, Surgeon General of the Army from 1895 to 1902 and founder of the Army Medical School, by former student Dr. Richard Slee in 1913. It was awarded to the student with the highest proficiency in bacteriology and serum therapy. His widow, Martha L. Sternberg, requested control of the medal in 1921, and the medal was then awarded to the student with the highest class standing in Preventive Medicine.

The Skinner Medal was named after MAJ John C Skinner. It was awarded to the graduate with the highest proficiency in Military Hospital Efficiency and Administration. It was only awarded from 1917 to 1920. MAJ Skinner had given the school discretion in awarding the medal, so the medal was transferred to the Medical Field Service School at the end of 1920.

The Slee Medal was named after Dr. Richard Slee. Dr. Slee had originally established the Sternberg Medal in 1913. When he relinquished the control of that medal to Mrs. Sternberg, he changed the

name of his medal and awarded it to the graduate with the highest proficiency in Immunology. It was only awarded from 1921 to 1923.

The Hoskins Medal for Veterinary Officers and the Dental Corps Medal were both first awarded in 1924. The Dental Corp medal was awarded retroactively to years 1922 and 1923. It was discontinued after being awarded in 1934.

Biographical information of the Clinical Pharmacology Fellows from 2003-2006 has been removed and is stored separately due to privacy concerns.

Subseries 1: Tropical Medicine Course (8-0-37)

The Tropical and Military Medicine Course has its origins in the need during WWII to train new medical officers on military medical practice and problems in foreign areas. The course was established by COL Richard Pearson Strong and the first class was in July 1941. The course name was later changed to the Advanced Military Preventive Medicine Course in 1953, then to the Global Medicine Course in 1966. The Global Medicine Course was replaced in 1972 by two separate courses: Tropical Medicine and Military Medical Ecology. The new Tropical Medicine Course ended in 1995, to be reformed in 2010.

This subseries includes the class rosters and graduation exercise programs of the Tropical Medicine Course. There are photographs of some of the classes in the Records of the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research AV Materials.

Subseries 2: Medical Basic Sciences Course (8-0-26), Military Medicine and Allied Science Course, Research Training Fellowship Program (8-0-38), Military Medical Science Fellowship Program, 1947-2006

Medical Basic Sciences Course (8-0-26) first became a separate formal course in 1948. It is the successor to the original basic sciences course which has been given in one form or another since the inception of the Army Medical School. It provided refresher education for medical officers returning from the Korean War. In 1954 it changed format and became the Military Medicine and Allied Sciences Course (8-0-38). The new format decreased the number of students to carefully selected medical officers and became research-oriented training. The course was again renamed to the Research Training Fellowship Program for the school year 1970-1971. There were no classes for the years 1976 and 1977. Classes were then suspended from 1979 to 1983 due to a manpower shortage. The name changed again to Military Medical Science Fellowship Program for the class of 1984-1985. The student with the highest class proficiency was awarded the Hoff Medal (see next subseries). The class folders may include schedules of courses, graduation programs, reviews of required papers, clippings, announcements of courses, and photographs (transferred to photo boxes and so indicated by separation sheets). Not all types of documents will be found in every class folder. Biographical information of the students has been removed and is stored separately due to privacy concerns. This subseries also includes some administrative records. Photographs can be found in the Records of the WRAIR AV Materials.

Series VI: Army Veterinary School, 1924-1993 and undated

The Army Veterinary School was established in June of 1920 in Chicago as the School of Military Meat and Dairy Hygiene and Forage Inspection. In 1923 it joined the Army Medical School and Army Dental School to form the Medical Department Professional Service Schools. This series contains class transcripts from 1924 through 1939 when the course was stopped. Two new courses were established to train veterinarians for the war. The Hoskins Medal for Veterinary Officers was first awarded in 1924. This series also contains correspondence related to various studies conducted around the United States.
